From the moment it was first proposed, the role of the nurse practitioner has been steeped in controversy. In the fields of

strategies"-- This study is a systematic review of literature analyzing the current research to determine the association of utilization of the acute care nurse practitioner (ACNP) on healthcare outcomes. The specific healthcare outcomes that were studied included hospital costs, length of hospitalization, and patient satisfaction after the addition of the ACNP. An extensive search using databases such as Cumulative Index to Nursing & Allied Health Literature (CINAHL), Medline, and PubMed were used with strict inclusion criteria for the articles. Eleven articles were reviewed and analyzed to find that ACNPs are effective

healthcare professionals with a background in nursing and significantly improve clinical outcomes when teamed with a physician in an acute care setting. The review concluded that the ACNP role should be implemented into a collaborative healthcare team to provide high quality patient care and further research should be conducted to evaluate their role in a model of healthcare that utilizes their full scope of practice.
